Review of School Admissions and Exclusions in Lincolnshire

A group of nine members, consisting of County Councillors and Church Representatives, are carrying out a review into school admissions and exclusions in Lincolnshire. As part of this review the members are looking at how the Council can best champion the needs of vulnerable children especially those with special educational needs and disability needs to ensure that they can access their preferred school, and how the Council can best support parents and carers with children with special educational needs and disability needs to attend the school which would best meet their identified special educational needs in relation to their age, ability and aptitude.

The members would like to speak to parents and carers with children with special educational needs and disability needs to find out how the Council can best support them and their child to access their preferred school and which best meets the child's needs. We are also interested in hearing about

- your experiences (good and bad) in accessing schools, any problems you may have encountered, and what support you received from Lincolnshire County Council.
- your experiences if your child has been excluded from school and what support you received from the school and Lincolnshire County Council.
- the experiences of your child(ren) if they are willing to speak or write to us about them.
- whether a school has tried to encourage you to look for another school for your child, such as for a fresh start, to avoid a permanent exclusion or because the school did not feel that it was not appropriate for your child.

You can take part in this review in a number of ways:
