

"We have recently received funding from the Dogs Trust to explore how pet ownership relates to dog quality of life, as well as family quality of life in families with children with ASD and ADHD.

It is important that we continue to conduct high profile research in this area in order to advance possible treatment protocols that maximise benefits for all those concerned (children, families and the dogs!).

As part of this study we are looking to interview around 20 parents of children (aged 4-10years) with ASD and/or ADHD who own a pet dog. The interview will take no longer than 30 minutes and will be conducted over the phone."

World Autism Awareness Week Saturday 2nd to Friday 8th April 2016

We know a lot of people have heard of autism. In fact, 99% of the public say they have. But how many actually understand autism?

To people with autism the world is a mass of people, places and events which they struggle to make sense of, which can cause them considerable stress and anxiety. In particular, understanding and relating to other people and taking part in everyday family and social life can be very hard.

At least 1 in 100 people in the UK have autism. In society as a whole, a lack of understanding of autistic people and their families can stop individuals from reaching their full potential, and can lead to social isolation and mental health issues.

We know that by supporting everyone to understand autism future generations will have the knowledge and understanding to accept and empathise with autistic people.

It would be fantastic if you could help to raise awareness. You may already be aware that within Lincolnshire there is the Autism Partnership working on the implementation of the All-Age Autism Strategy (please find enclosed).
