INVITATION TO TAKE PART IN A RESEARCH STUDY

WHO AM I AND WHAT IS THE STUDY?

My name is Amy Hogg and I am a third year psychology student at the University of Lincoln, and this study is for my dissertation. The project is titled "Developmental patterns of sensory and autistic behaviours in children on the autism spectrum". It aims to examine the developmental trajectories of sensory sensitivities (hyper/hypo), and to what extent they influence the expression of autistic symptoms.

BACKGROUND

Why carry out this study?

Previous research has shown that sensory sensitivities are more prominent in younger children with ASC. These sensitivities interfere with aspects of everyday life, such as learning, and their ability to explore and interact with the environment. What we want to do is see how these sensory sensitivities emerge and develop over time. This information could contribute to our understanding of the role of sensory sensitivities, and the part that they play in the development of autistic behaviours and abilities.

WHY DOES THIS MATTER?

It is important to understand the developmental trajectories of sensory sensitivities in autism as it will better our understanding of the needs of individuals with autism. It is the first step in working towards making sure that individuals with ASC have these needs met. Furthermore, help to ensure that suitable interventions and treatment protocols are put into place.

CAN I TAKE PART?

We are looking for parents and caregivers of children aged 3-14 years with a formal ASC diagnosis.

HOW DO I TAKE PART?

If you are interested in taking part, you (the caregiver) will be required to complete two online questionnaires about your child. One questionnaire measures autistic traits in children, the other measures sensory behaviour. Both questionnaires should take no longer than 25 minutes to complete.
