I have really wanted in this months newsletter to highlight Aspergers in women as it is important to raise awareness of it. Aspergers in women is thought to be as high as 2:1 (M:F). Women are more likely to be diagnosed with bipolar, depression or something else. Statistically no one really knows haw common ASD is in men and women but it currently stands at about 1 in 100. I personally believe that figure is much higher as men/boys are still undiagnosed especially men and even today some boys will still go into adulthood without having been diagnosed.

As for women/girls it is very rarely picked up and diagnosed as ASD in girls/ women is thought to be different compared to boys/men and it is also thought to be a men/boy thing. Girls will also go through life and school not having the same level of challenging behaviours and social interaction compared to boys, which makes it harder for professionals to have concerns over girls.
