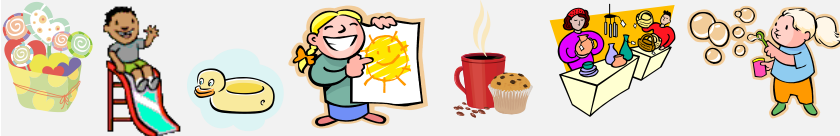

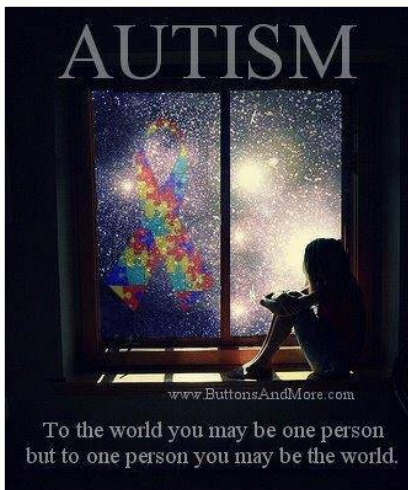

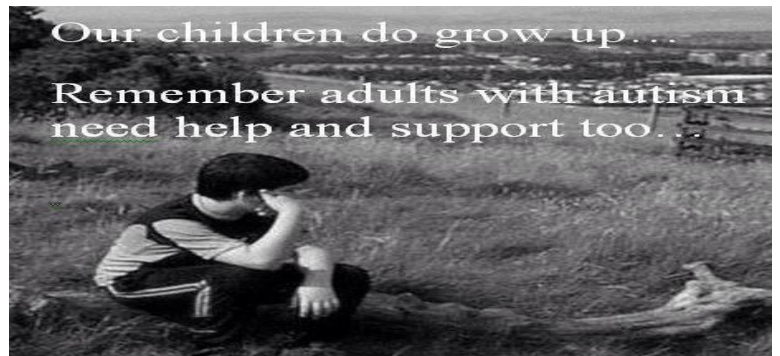

Remember adults with autism need help and support too...



Do you have an adult brother or sister with autism?

For too long there has been a tendency to view autism as a condition solely affecting children. But people with autism grow up and become older adults.

Ageing parents, who have helped provide support, sometimes look to the next generation to take over when they can no longer manage. The siblings of adults with autism face particular problems. Many are willing to take on support roles, but they find it difficult to access the information needed to help their brothers and sisters with autism.

They also need support for themselves and their own families. The Autism in Maturity project has joined forces with Sibs, the UK charity representing the needs of siblings of disabled people, to provide a forum for the siblings of adults with autism. This is a place where siblings can discuss issues and help each other.
