

Research aims to explore the fatigue experienced by adults with Developmental Coordination Disorder/Dyspraxia as the clinicians at the Centre are increasingly finding that clients with the disorder are reporting high levels of fatigue and some have a dual diagnosis of DCD and Chronic Fatigue Syndrome (CFS).
